

Pennsylvania Government Explores Ways to Implement USA Technologies' EnergyMiser® Statewide

"Conservation Technology Offers Opportunity to Reduce Energy Bill and Benefit Taxpayers"

MALVERN, Pa, September 6, 2006 -- USA Technologies (OTC Bulletin Board: USAT) announced today that the Pennsylvania Secretary for General Services, James Creedon, has asked his department to explore ways to utilize the company's energy conservation technology throughout the Commonwealth.

Secretary Creedon visited USA Technologies to inspect the company's EnergyMiser energy management technology and later reported the technology was of extreme importance to energy conservation in the State.

"The company's conservation technology offers an opportunity for Pennsylvania to reduce energy consumption and lower its energy bill which is of enormous benefit to State taxpayers," said Secretary Creedon.

The Department of General Services is responsible for energy management across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

USA Technologies executives demonstrated the technology to Secretary Creedon and showed how it could save the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania an estimated \$56 million in energy costs and reduce energy consumption by approximately 642 million kilowatt hours if installed on vending machines and glass-front coolers in the State.

"We welcome the Pennsylvania Government's recognition of our EnergyMiser technology and are delighted that Secretary Creedon has recommended his department work with us to expand its implementation in Pennsylvania, as well as promote it to governments, business and industry nationwide," said Stephen P. Herbert, President and COO, USA Technologies. "Governor Rendell is recognized for his leadership in energy conservation and environmental protection, and as a Pennsylvania-based energy conservation company, we are proud to be recognized for our contribution towards reducing energy consumption and CO2 emission," he said.

There are an estimated 600,000 vending machines and coolers in Pennsylvania and more than 14 million nationwide. USA Technologies' EnergyMiser product line is able to reduce energy consumption in vending machines, coolers, and various appliances and electronics by up to 45 percent.
